Thank you for choosing Websense Express! This paper provides an overview of the steps to install and begin using Websense Express. For detailed installation instructions, refer to the *Websense Express Installation Guide*. If you purchased a machine with Websense Express preinstalled, refer to the *Websense Express Quick Setup Card* shipped with the product. The Websense Express Setup program installs:

- **Websense Express:** Web filtering solution, that improves Internet security and employee productivity, reduces legal liability, and optimizes the use of IT resources.
- **Websense Manager:** configure filtering policies and monitoring of Internet usage on your network.
- **Websense Explorer:** powerful reporting tool that works with Websense Express to identify risks related to network security, legal liability, employee productivity, and bandwidth loss in your organization.

➔ Before you install

Ensure that you have the necessary equipment and software to support your Websense Express installation. The following hardware and software are required to install Websense Express on a dedicated Windows® Server 2003 machine.

✓ Hardware

- Dual-Core Intel® Xeon®, 2.13 GHz
- 2 GB RAM
- 160 GB free disk space
- 2 network interface cards (NICs)
Both NICs need to be connected to the Internet before beginning the installation. Do not try to change the NIC configuration while Setup is running.
- CD-ROM drive
- DO NOT install Websense Express on a firewall.

✓ Supported operating systems

- Microsoft Windows 2003 Server SP1 or later (32 bit)
- Microsoft Windows 2003 Server R2 or later (32 bit)

✓ Software

- Windows Internet Explorer® 6 or later
- Adobe® Reader® 6 or later
- Note that Microsoft® SQL Server Desktop Engine (MSDE) and Apache™ HTTP Server are automatically installed by Websense Express. An installed, previous version or MSDE could impact the installation.

✓ Network visibility

- The machine running Websense Express must have bi-directional access to all Internet traffic, allowing it to read packets *from* the network and write packets *to* the network.

➔ Ten steps to an easy installation

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| <p>➊ Log on to the installation machine with local or domain administrator privileges.</p> <p>➋ Go to the Downloads page on the Websense corporate Web site, www.websense.com.</p> <p>➌ Open <code>WebsenseExpress10_Setup.exe</code> and extract the Websense Express Setup program and files. The file is named <code>WebsenseExpress10_Setup_localized.exe</code> for non-English installations.</p> <p>➍ Select a NIC to communicate with users.</p> <p>➎ Enter a user name and password to allow Websense Express to access MSDE for reporting purposes.</p> <p>➏ Set the installation locations for Websense Express and the log database files used for reporting.</p> <p>➐ Select a network card (NIC) to monitor Internet requests.</p> <p>➑ Select Yes if you would like to send protocol information to Websense, Inc.</p> <p>➒ Enter a domain administrator user name and password.</p> <p>➓ At the final screen, you can choose to start Websense Manager before clicking Finish.</p> | <p>Close all applications and stop any anti-virus software. If Windows Firewall is installed, ensure that it is disabled.</p> <p>Download the Websense Express software package to your local hard drive.</p> <p>Follow the prompts through the Subscription Agreement screen.</p> <p>Block messages are sent through this NIC.</p> <p>Setup installs MSDE. Setup prompts you to exit if either an unsupported version of MSDE or Microsoft SQL Server is found on the system.</p> <p>The default location is under <code>C:\Program Files\Websense</code></p> <p>This card must be connected to a port on a switch or hub that sees all Internet requests.</p> <p>No private information is sent.</p> <p>This information allows Websense Express to access directory information to identify users.</p> <p>A tutorial is available in Websense Manager to learn basic configuration and administration.</p> |
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➔ Getting started

If you did not start Websense Manager when you completed the installation, double-click on the Websense desktop icon; or from **Start** menu, select **Programs > Websense > Websense Manager**. The default user for Websense Manager is **WebsenseAdministrator**.

When you first access Websense Manager, you are prompted to enter a new password, at least 4 characters long. This user name and password also can be used to access the reporting tools. A tutorial is provided to introduce you to Websense Manager. The *Websense Express User's Guide* and online help provide further instructions.
